# **SEPTEMBER**

### CELEBRATE OUR FAITH

During the Penitential Rite at the
beginning of Mass, we pause to
reflect on our sins and pray for
God's mercy. The penitential
season of Lent challenges us
even deeper into reflection. The
three practices of Lent – Prayer,
Fasting and Almsgiving – help us
empty ourselves to receive mercy
and love from God.

# **MARCH**

#### **CELEBRATE THE CHANGE**

Holy week is just around the corner. During this high point of the liturgical year, we enter into Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. This is a time of rich liturgical celebrations, including the institution of the Eucharist – bread and wine transformed into Christ's Body and Blood.

# **APRIL**

#### CELEBRATE THE CALL

We are called, just as the first disciples, to bring the message of the risen Christ to the world. We are sent from Mass to "go and announce the Gospel of the Lord."
