TAKE UP YOUR CROSS & FOLLOW ME

There are three interwoven themes in today's four readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

In the first reading the Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God daily (Is 50:5-9a).

The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help; always ready to save us (Psalm 116).

As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results (James 2:14-18).

Jesus is the Suffering Servant who must suffer, be rejected, die and rise again. His followers must deny oneself, and take up the cross and follow him (Mark 8:27-35).

Seven Generations - A Parish

The wisdom of a liturgical consultant some years ago asked that a parish always look at itself as a living organism of the gospel that always sees itself in the context of seven generations. Typically, those living in the present is viewed as the fourth generation serving as a bridge between the third and fifth. He said that it is helpful to realize that there have been in the parish those who lived before us, some of whom are the elders living among us. And there will be those who will follow us, again, some of whom may be the youngest in our midst. We need to be grateful for those three generations who came before us, passing on all that we have; i.e., our faith, our heritage and our facilities. It was their care/love for the Church that brought us to where we are today. They took pride in what they did.

As the fourth generation, we take hold of what has been handed on to us and embrace it: our faith, our heritage and our facilities. We have the responsibility to maintain and care for them. We too must see ourselves as a living organism of the gospel that must grow and adapt. Our adults continue to pass the faith on to our youth, just as was done for us when we were the youth. Recently, I highlighted some of the needs of our physical facilities and how we have been taking care of them. This is one of the critical things that the fourth generation is called upon to do.

The generations before us felt it important to make the decisions that they did to create the facilities we have. Those decisions over the years have given us great facilities as well as some indebtedness at both campuses. Therefore, in addition to passing on the faith, it is our turn to make sure that we update, maintain and assume debt reduction as one of the responsibilities that is placed in our hands. It would be an error to think that since we were not part of the earlier generations that took responsibility for what they believed to be best, that we need not take the responsibility that is in our hands as members of the parish. What does that say to those who follow us as the fifth generation?

What we have has been given to us as gift. Like those who came before us, we must take great pride in the decisions we make so that we can pass on our faith, our heritage and our facilities. This will happen if we see ourselves as a parish that is living the message of the Gospel. And like all living things, we take on the challenge (and gift) to grow and change.






